Osage County Community Living

Pathways Community Health

Provides a continuum of community mental health services, including individual counseling, marital and family counseling, psychiatric rehabilitation, psychiatry and medication services, and adolescent substance abuse counseling. Phone: (573) 634-3000

Rape and Abuse Crisis Service (RACS)

Provides assistance to low-income individuals and families in crisis. Senior Nutrition Council
