As I reflect on this past year, I am filled with immense pride and gratitude for how far our organization has come. Thanks to your unwavering support and commitment, what once seemed like a distant dream has become a remarkable reality.

In 2011, we served just 39 children. In 2024, that number has grown to 160. More importantly, we have expanded our reach beyond children under 10, now advocating for older youth until they age out at 21. This year alone, six young people served by our CASA volunteers have graduated from high school or trade school—two are even in their second semester of college! These milestones would not be possible without the dedication of our incredible volunteers, who refuse to give up on any child. As one volunteer so powerfully put it, "There are no bad children, only children in bad places."

Looking ahead to 2025, we still need more community volunteers to step forward to ensure that every child who needs a CASA volunteer has one. Every child deserves a CASA volunteer to guide them through the uncertainties and profound unknowns in the child welfare system. With your continued partnership, we can work toward a future where every child has a voice and someone to fight for them.

Thank you for being part of this mission. We couldn't do it without you!


