



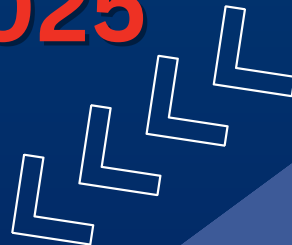

As we begin a new year, I want to offer a heartfelt thank you to everyone who has given their time, talent, or treasure to support children in our community who have experienced abuse and neglect. Because of you, Capital City CASA shows up for children when they need it most. This year, our goal is to train and assign 21 new CASA volunteers to children currently waiting for an advocate, with a long-term vision of serving 90% of children in Cole County by 2029.

At our Raise Your Glass event, our speaker captured our mission perfectly: “Every child is one caring adult away from being a success story.” In 2025, 146 children who once felt unseen now have a consistent, caring adult by their side. They are reminded that their voice matters and that their future can be defined by possibility rather than their past. Behind every statistic in this report is a child whose life has been changed through hundreds of hours and thousands of miles devoted by CASA volunteers.

Whether you are a volunteer, donor, board member, community partner, or supporter, you play a vital role in bringing stability, dignity, and hope to children during some of the most challenging moments of their young lives.

As we look ahead, I invite you to deepen your impact by volunteering, sharing our mission, or making a gift to support our volunteers and expand our reach so every child who needs a CASA volunteer has one. 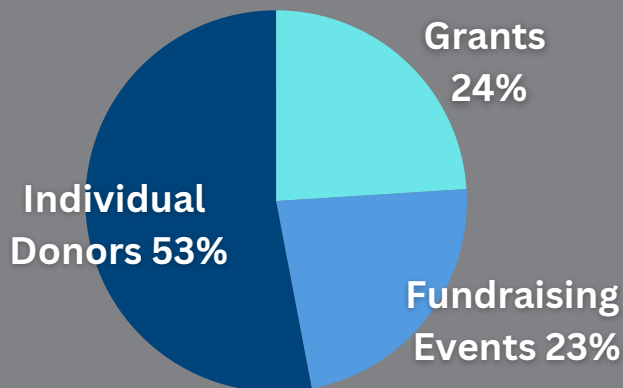

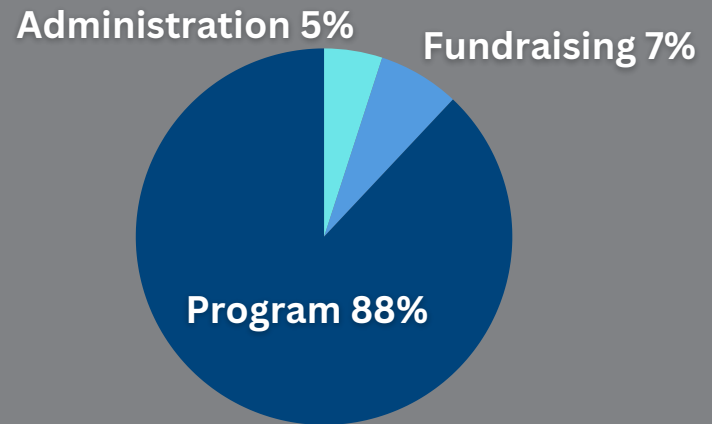


Key Statistics at a Glance

Capital City CASA Volunteer Impact

Our CASA volunteers make a direct impact on a child's life.

Finding a CASA volunteer to walk along side a teen in foster care is a challenge, but finding a male volunteer to advocate for a teenage boy in foster care is like making that 3-point shot at the buzzer to win the game. And that is exactly what CASA Steve has done. He gets the assist in helping this young man achieve great things. Things most teens take for granted, like getting his driver's license, a part time job, graduating from high school and enrolling in a trade school. CASA Steve has been that one, consistent adult who doesn't judge his circumstances, but instead encourages him by being there when he just need someone to talk to.



CASA Cheryl has been a dedicated CASA volunteer since February 2022. When one child reentered foster care, CASA Cheryl agreed to be her CASA again, demonstrating true commitment.

The 12-year-old girl, who has faced significant trauma, benefits from the steady comfort, guidance, and trust provided by CASA Cheryl. The child confides in CASA Cheryl and often asks for more visits, which CASA Cheryl gladly provides. Cheryl's empathy, patience, and unwavering dedication make her an invaluable advocate for the children she serves.



CASA Mary advocates for a 15-year-old girl who has been in and out of foster care for 7 years. The girl has a history of physical and emotional abuse and abandonment by her family. Case managers came and went, but the girl needed someone consistent—often calling CASA Mary nightly to have someone to talk to. Today, she's working, studying for her GED, and learning to be independent.

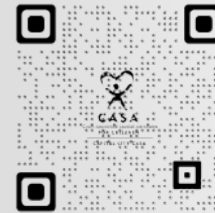
CASA Mary has advocated for the girl's education, bridged communication, and helped her secure essentials like a birth certificate and Social Security card.
